
Brain Injury Specialty Program

The Acute Brain Injury Specialty Program at Kaiser Foundation Rehabilitation Center is an individualized, outcome-driven and integrated rehabilitation program that addresses the complicated needs of persons who have experienced a brain injury. Our program focuses on preventing further impairment and reducing disability to promote an optimal quality of life for our members. Our goal is to achieve functional outcomes focused on home and community integration and enhancement of self worth and engagement in productive activities. We served 74 individuals with traumatic brain injury and 75 individuals with non-traumatic brain injury in 2018. The average number of days our patients stayed in the acute rehabilitation program was 13 days for both traumatic brain injury and non-traumatic brain injury in 2018.

97% of our members surveyed reported that they were satisfied or very satisfied after their stay at Kaiser Foundation Rehabilitation Center in the Brain Injury Specialty Program 2018.



We are proud to report that our patients have a higher rate of returning to the community than other rehabilitation facilities in the nation.

89% of our brain injury patients met the goals for improving their functioning.
