# What should you do?

What can you do? Seek the support of caring people. They may be your friends, family members, neighbors, medical professionals, or people who work at the agencies listed in this brochure. Talk with them in a private, safe place.

Explain the situation to your children. The following are sample statements you may use: "What happened is not your fault"; "Hitting is one way of being mean. Hurting someone's feelings with name calling or threats is mean, too"; "When adults hit each other, it is not OK, and they need help to stop."

If you think a friend is being abused... and an assault is occurring call 911. Don't downplay the danger. Don't judge your friend's choices. Your friend may feel that he or she has nowhere to go or that it is his or her fault. Give emotional support. Your friend may feel hurt, angry, afraid, ashamed, or trapped. Offer to help with childcare or transportation. Express concern for your friend's safety. And tell your friend about agencies that can help.
