**2018 Antelope Valley Community Benefit Grants  
Total: Approximately \$139,314**

**Antelope Valley College Foundation** received funding to expand mental health and crisis support services for Antelope Valley College's uninsured and lower income student population including a focus on veterans' services and professional development.

**Antelope Valley Family YMCA** received funding to support access for low-income residents to their Healthy Lifestyles Program emphasizing physical activity, nutrition, weight management, stress management, health education, screenings, social and spiritual health.

**Bartz-Altadonna Community Health Center** received funding to support their homeless healthcare access team providing outreach, navigation, and case management connecting the homeless to coordinated care.

**Boys & Girls Club of the Antelope Valley** received funding to support their Triple Play program inclusive of Healthy Habits curriculum and physical activity for all students receiving after school care.

**The Children's Center of Antelope Valley** received funding on behalf of the Antelope Valley Health Neighborhood collaborative focusing on efforts to reduce perinatal mood and anxiety and infant mortality in the Antelope Valley while forming a maternal mental health network.

**The Catalyst Foundation** received funding to provide outreach, counseling, case management, linkages to social services, and benefit enrollment support for high risk homeless individuals.

**Los Angeles Family Housing** received funding to expand street outreach efforts in the Antelope Valley linking the homeless to transitional and permanent supportive housing and long-term stability.

**Mental Health America of Los Angeles** received funding to support Operation Healthy Homecoming, a mental health outreach, education, counseling, and prevention program and housing program for returning military and veterans who are homeless or at risk for homelessness.

**Palmdale Community Foundation** received funding to support the construction of a fitness court at Pelona Vista Park encouraging individuals and families in this high need area to participate in free classes focused on the adoption of healthy, active lifestyles.

**Planned Parenthood of Los Angeles** received funding to support access to reproductive and sexual health care including pre-natal care, cervical cancer screenings, and testing, treatment, and prevention of STIs and information through the Promotoras Comunitarias program for low-income individuals.

**Tarzana Treatment Center, Inc.** received funding to support access to primary medical care for lower income, uninsured, and homeless patients living with diabetes.



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
